## **English**

This half term, we shall be recapping all of the genres of writing that children have looked at this year. Children will have an opportunity to review their writing and apply their knowledge and skills to make improvements to their original pieces.

## **Maths**

We will be revising key concepts in mathematics, such as the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) as well as consolidating knowledge on fractions, decimals and percentages. We will also be developing understanding of statistics and geometry.

## **Computing**

In computing, they will be learning about e-safety including cyber safety research. We will also work on creating our own yearbook and use of spreadsheets.

## **Geography**

As part of our geography topic, we will be continuing to learn about rivers around the world, their features, benefits of cities being built around rivers and how this impacts human geography.

## **PE**

Our outdoor PE sessions take place on a Friday afternoon. They involve rounders and cricket, building on throwing and catching skills. After the half term we will be learning about athletics and taking part in different athletic activities.

## **PSHE/British Values**

This term in British Values, we will be looking at mutual respect. Children will be learning about the importance of respecting people from different cultures, backgrounds and homes.

## **RSE**

We will be learning about relationships, resolving conflict, taking risks, stereotyping and prejudice and discrimination.

## **Music**

Later on in the term, the children will be rehearsing songs for the Leaver's Assembly.

## **Diversity**

This term we are celebrating diversity by learning about the diverse river cultures around the world.

## **Homework**

English and Maths homework are set on Friday and due in the following Thursday. Homework usually consists of a SPaG, comprehension and maths task.

## **Reading**

Pupils are expected to read for at least 10 minutes every night.
